WOKSAPE TIPI - House of Wisdom

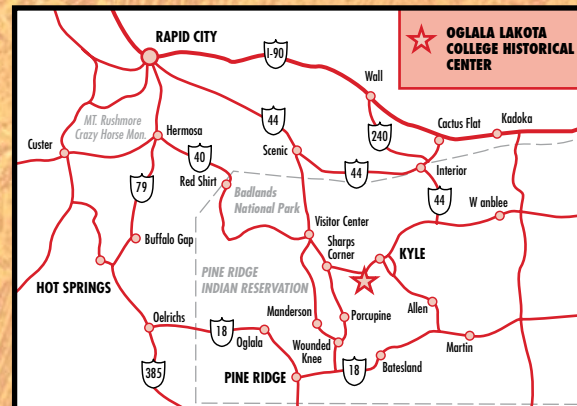
Woksape Tipi is the Learning Resource Center (LRC) for Oglala Lakota College and serves ten branch libraries located at the nine college centers on the Pine Ridge Reservation and one in the Black Hills. The Learning Resource Center is the public as well as the academic library for the Pine Ridge Reservation. The LRC contains an extensive display of Oglala Lakota WWI, Korean and Viet Nam veterans.

ARCHIVES

The Oglala Lakota College Archives is the official archival repository of OLC, the American Indian Higher Education Consortium (AIHEC), and the Pine Ridge Reservation. In addition, the Archives hold extensive records from the Oglala Sioux Tribe (OST) as well as special collections acquired from various sources.

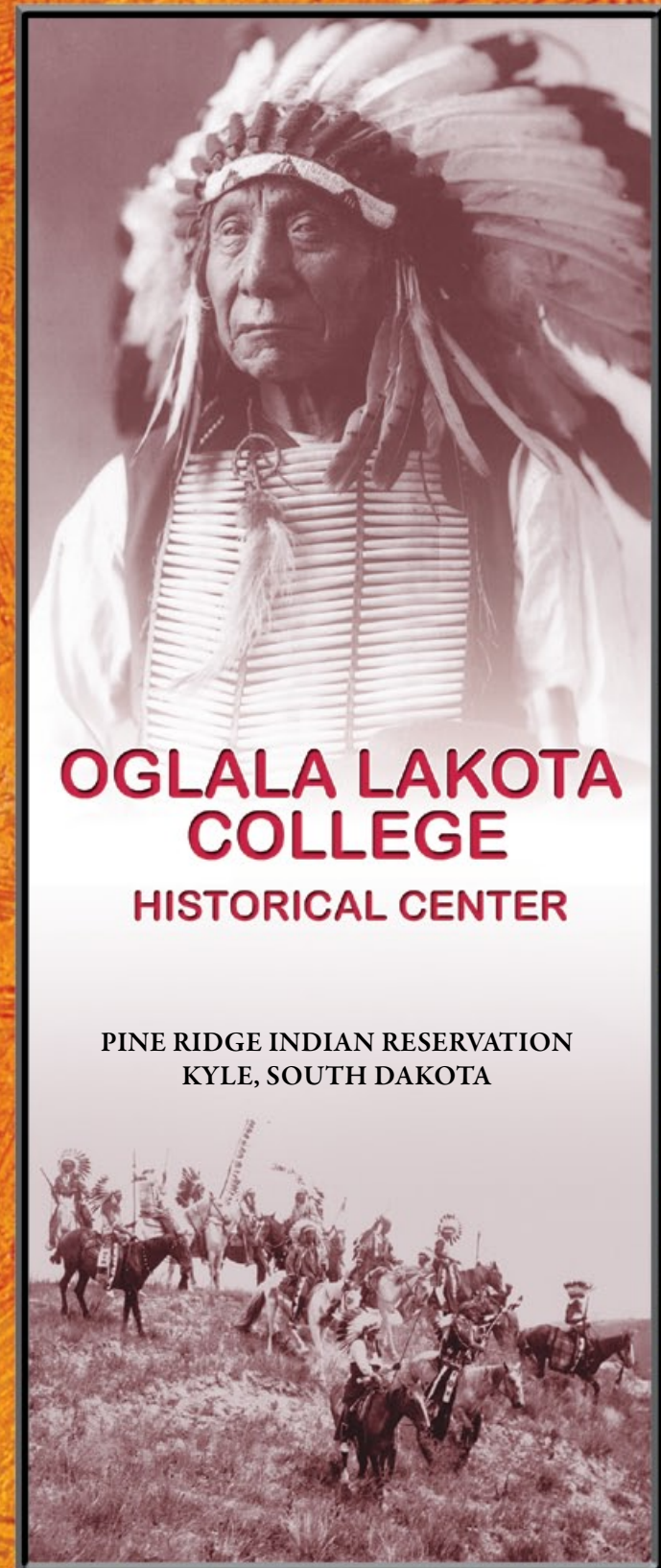
