Native Range: Very diverse

Season of Growth: Cool season deciduous perennial colonial tree

Plant Family: Salicaceae, Willow

Common Use:

Bark used as a fever remedy

Bark used for scurvy

Fair to good forage for livestock, and excellent for wildlife

Wood used for pulp and lumber
